## <u>ORDER</u>

The present appeal is filed against the letter dated 14.02.2011 issued by the Additional CPFC, Chennai, to the appellant in respect of levy of damages against M/s Arjun Associates Pvt. Ltd., Chennai. The counsel for the Appellant requested for waiver of amount of damages levied under Section 14-B of the EPF & MP Act 1952.

Section 7-I of the EPF & MP Act provides that any person aggrieved by a notification issued by the Central Govt., or an order passed by the Central Govt. or any authority, under the proviso to sub-section (3), or sub-Section (4) of section 1, or section 3, or sub-section (1) of section 7-A, or section 7B [except an order rejecting an application for review referred to in sub-section (5) thereof], or section 7C, or section 14B, may prefer an appeal to a Tribunal against such notification or order.

Since the letter dated 14.02.2011 issued by the Additional CPFC, Chennai, to M/s. HDFC Bank Ltd., the appellant does not fall within the ambit of Section 7 I of the Act, it is not appealable. Therefore, the present appeal is not maintainable; hence, it is dismissed. Copy of the Order be sent to both the parties. File be consigned to the record room.
